

Tree Climbing Camp



Have you ever looked at an old-growth tree in the forest and wondered how you would get up there when the first branches are hundreds of feet up, or what the view would look like at the top of the canopy from a giant tree? Join this camp and you will have fun experiencing it all! Have fun playing around with different climbing techniques, equipment, knots, outdoor safety skills and learning how trees talk to each other! Oh did we mention you also get to fly drones and use giant sling shots to set climbing lines in trees?

Food: Participants should bring water, snacks, and a meal for a lunch break. Climbing can be an intensive and demanding activity that requires sustained energy. Snack should include slow burning foods that release calories over time like nuts, nut butter, fruit or a healthy trail mix. Bars with added sugar and syrup are not recommended.

Equipment: Participants should bring extra layers in case of weather changes or rain and wear outdoorsy clothes that they do not mind getting dirty or scraped up. All climbing equipment will be provided at no extra charge. Sun protection (make sure any sunscreen won't sting your eyes when sweating)

Weather: In the event of rain, climbing will continue and participants should bring protective rain gear. If there is any sign of thunder or lightning, or very heavy rain, climbing will be canceled and rescheduled to a later day, no refunds of fees for weather. Participants will be contacted and informed of any adverse weather decisions.

Transportation: Parents are required to provide their kids transportation to the meeting location at 9am. The meeting location is in North Beach parking-lot at in Deception Pass State Park.

Park Fees: There are no fees for entering the Deception Pass State Park to drop off your kid. If you are just dropping off your kid you can skip the ticket booth and drive past on your right even without a pass. If you are parking to watch your kid or want to stay in the park after dropping off your kid, you will need to purchase an annual Discover Pass to park your car for an extended time. (\$35/year or \$11.50/day)

Location and Directions: Canopy Climbing is located in the State Park Deception Pass. Enter the entrance on the south side of the bridge through the ticket booth. A Discover Pass is required and can be purchased at the entrance ticket booth or online. After the main entrance, stay right until you reach a dead end with a cul-de-sac, also known as North Beach parking lot. Canopy climbing will be set up in this cul-de-sac, marked by signs.
